See, Test & Treat Background



- Delivers free cervical and breast cancer screening to uninsured and underinsured women in US communities
- Started in 2001
- Almost **7,000** women screened since inception
- 2019
 - 16 See, Test & Treat Programs held with 1,000 volunteers and 110 organizations participating
 - 870 women screened for cervical and breast cancer
 - 8 cancers detected



<u>Charge:</u> Communities of Practice offers program organizers and coordinators an opportunity to network with other program leads and coordinators, discuss and hear how other programs have faced program challenges and best practices for how to enhance or improve programs. The Communities of Practices gathers feedback and input from volunteers to improve See, Test & Treat program design and remove common obstacles faced by programs.

- Consists of
 - List-serve discussions/surveys
 - o 3-4 webinar discussions on pre-determined topics (February, March, April)
- Members
 - o 2020 programs representatives, and previous program representatives
 - Each program must identify 1 individual who will be the point person
